Greg has made a box out of River Oak with the lid out of Tasmanian myrtle. The trays inside are of silky oak. The Tas maple lid was sanded to 3000 grit, and all finished with a coat of Carnauba wax. The box lid was skilfully attached with a grain matched wooden hinge.

4. Rene Suter.

Rene's first items was one of his "Australian map" chopping boards made from various recycled timbers.

He also had a bird feeder made from recycled fence palings and a base of what was determined by the timber guru (Paul) as Red Iron Bark.

5. Max Koster.

Max took all inside to his dining room to show items he has made.

A. 3 Bandsaw boxes made from camphor laurel with red flocking in the draws.

B. Small bowl made from unidentified burl and resin highlights.

C. Max's dining table made from Western Australian river gum with a natural edge and resin highlights.
